To help promote the Emergency Broadband Benefit as a tool for the coming school year, the FCC has added new back to school themed materials to the EBB Outreach Toolkit. We hope that universities and K-12 schools will use these items to notify their communities about this important program designed to help eligible households get, or stay, connected.

Why Recycle

It Saves Energy-The energy required to make products using recycled materials is significantly less than the energy required to make products from raw materials. Consider this, it takes 20X the energy to create an aluminum can from raw materials when compared to recycled. You could create 20 recycled aluminum cans for the same energy cost as one!

Reduces Landfill Space-Landfills are unsightly, smelly, toxic areas as they contain all of the waste generated by residents, commercial organizations and industries in the region. The US Environmental Protection Agency estimates that nearly 75% of all waste that ends up in the landfill is recyclable. By gaining more participation in recycling we can significantly reduce the volume of waste in landfills and the number of landfills needed.



Cease the Grease

Pouring grease, oil or fat down the drain hurts. That's why you should let it cool, pour it in a disposable container and throw it in the trash.

Fat, grease and oil are a major cause of sewer line blockages. When grease accumulates in our sewer lines, it can cause wastewater back up, resulting in overflow that affects the quality of our water. When you cook hamburger meat please do not drain in the sink. When it cools in the drain line it will eventually cause a stop up. This can really be costly if we have to bring out a plumber to unstop it.

Follow these important guidelines , so you don't cause a pain in the drain.
